The healthcare industry has changed dramatically since Community Hospital Corporation was established as a not-for-profit company by a group of concerned hospital leaders to preserve healthcare in local communities. CHC establishes CHC ContinueCARE to advance long-term acute care hospitals, or LTACHs.

CHC, through a partnership with HealthTrust, offers group purchasing organization (GPO) access to community hospitals and in 2015, launches **CHC Supply Trust**.

Jim Kendrick becomes President and CEO, replacing CEO founder Mike Williams. Jim continues advocacy for rural and community hospital innovation and advancement.
